Rejuvenation and revival

Holy Child Public School saw its opening in the virtual mode for the academic year 2021-22 on 01.04.2021. Being the year of pandemic all activities were done in a blended mode. The sudden shift of education to this virtual platform brought several challenges. But our extensive effort to reach up to the parents through online orientation, telephonic conversation and webinars made the process smooth all through the session. Special assemblies, activities and events were also conducted virtually.

Academic excellence in school

We have adapted to the learning that took place beyond its walls, regularly assessing students' skills and tailoring learning opportunities to meet students at their skill level. Google forms, Kaahoot, Quizzes, and many other learning and gaming sites not only promoted blended learning but made learning fun and exciting. Blended learning took place in our school wherein teachers catered to the needs of children present in classroom and present beneath the screen. Challenges
